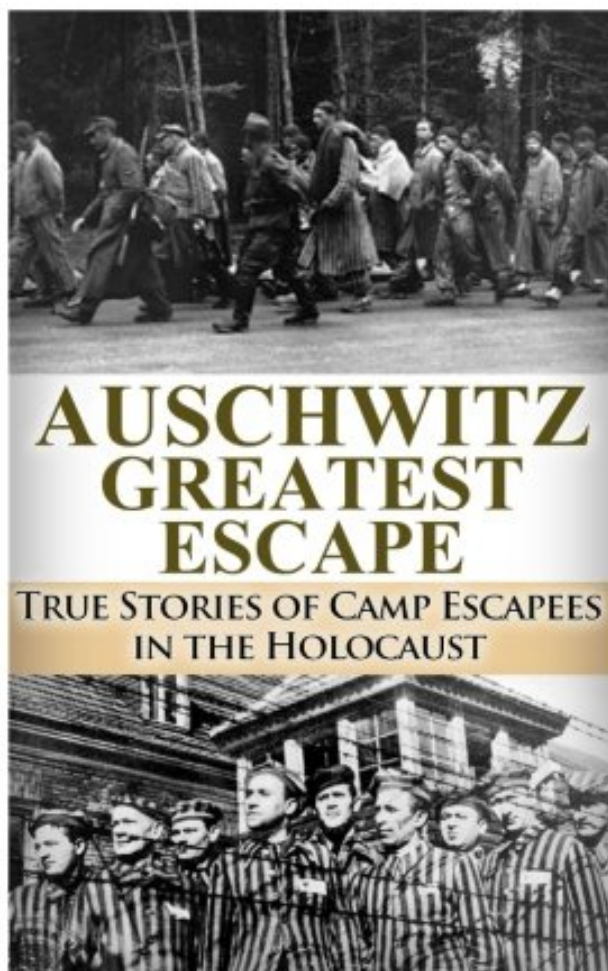

Ryan Jenkins penned this ebook that focuses on two such escapes. The first demonstrated the will to survive and tell the world about what was happening in Nazi-controlled Poland with the mass deportation of Eastern European Jews. The second escape occurred with a revolt in which prisoners lived or died with nothing to lose. What was interesting is the introduction to the book; that is, the author notes that while the prisoners and survivors of camps like Auschwitz were experts due to their experiences, their reports were not always first-hand. This is because their access was limited. They could report on the hearsay of soldiers guarding them or the feedback from those who had access to other parts of the camp, but they were not full, primary experts. Regardless, their stories remind readers that preparation, not panic, is the key to their survival.<sup>2</sup> of 2 people found the following review helpful.
