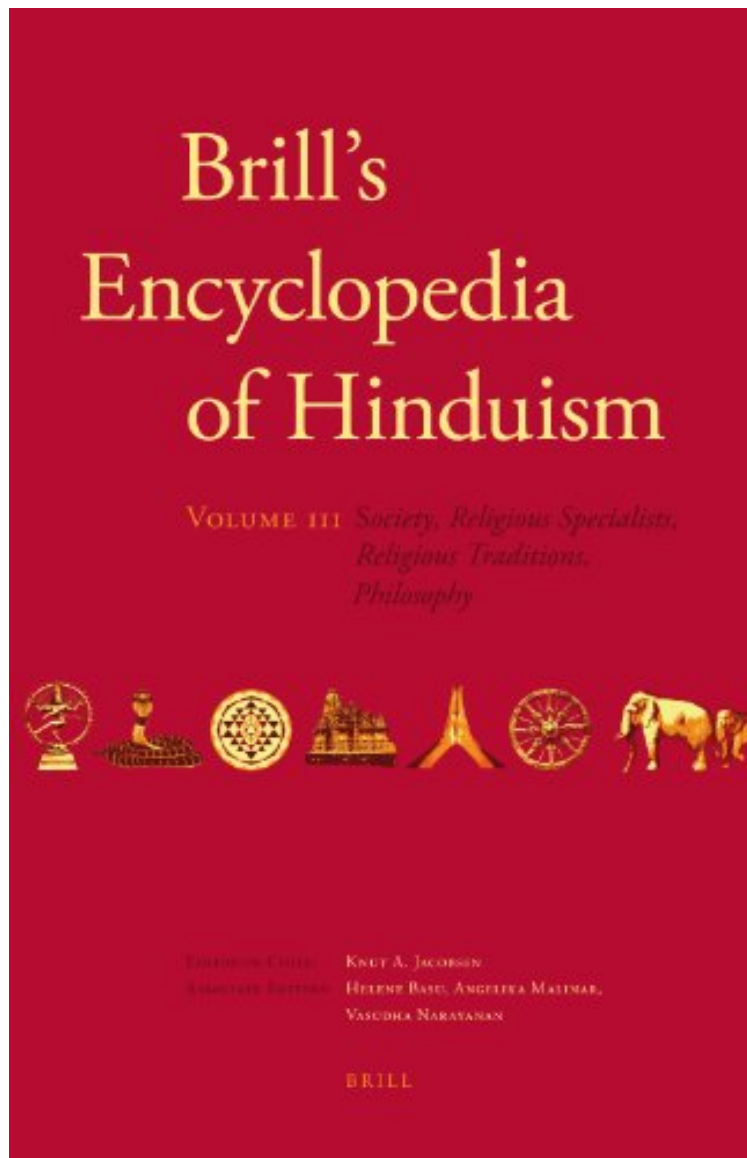

Religious traditions, presented in alphabetical order from Aghors and Buls to Vaikhansa and Vrkar Samprady, feature prominently as one of the anchor sections. Another major section presents a thorough examination of Hindu philosophical traditions, including history, branches, and contemporary aspects.
