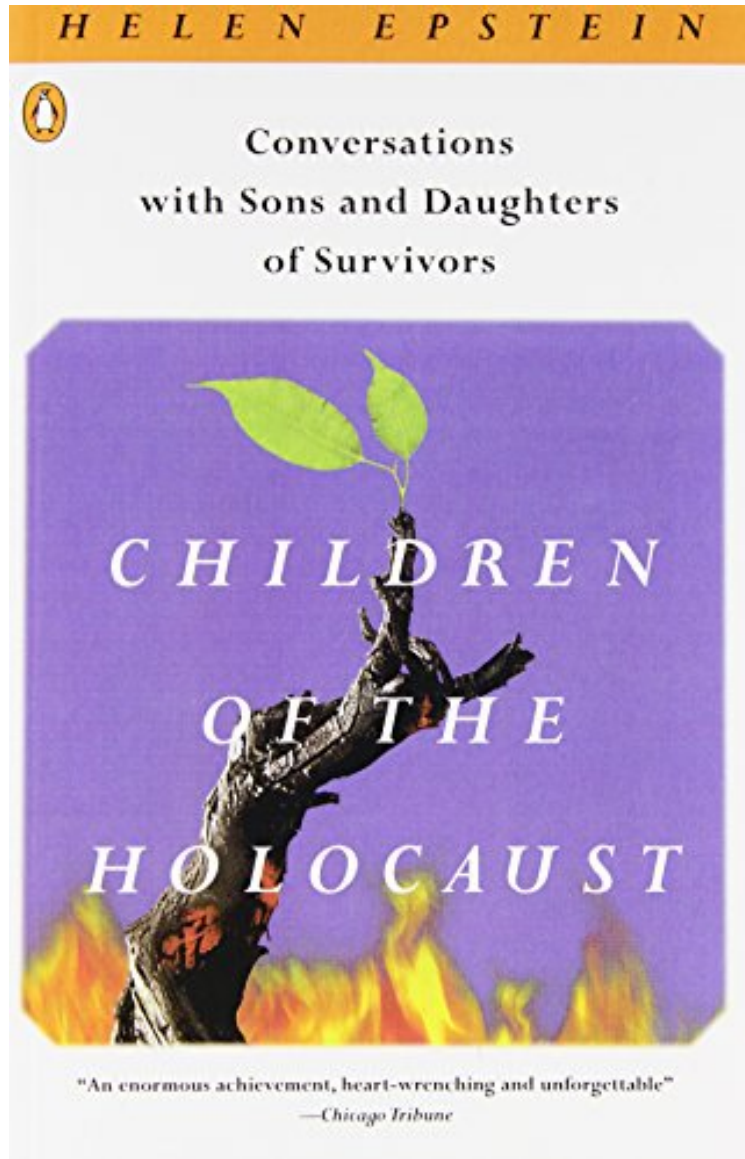

A Pivotal WorkBy Linda PressmanAs one of the first books which talked about what it was like being the child of Holocaust Survivors, Helen Epstein's book is truly pivotal but, as the child of survivors myself, I didn't find myself in this book. What I've found is that there were many kinds of Holocaust Survivor families - the types in which the parents didn't speak of their horrors and the types in which they spoke too much. In some families the children identified greatly with their parents' tragic pasts and in others, like my own, we ran from their stories. I think this is an important book, but not the final word on the subject. The experience of the Holocaust on a family might have been as individual as the Survivor and their children; to get an idea of what it was like to grow up with Survivor parents it's important to read many of these books.Looking Up: A Memoir of Sisters, Survivors and Skokie0 of 0 people found the following review helpful.
